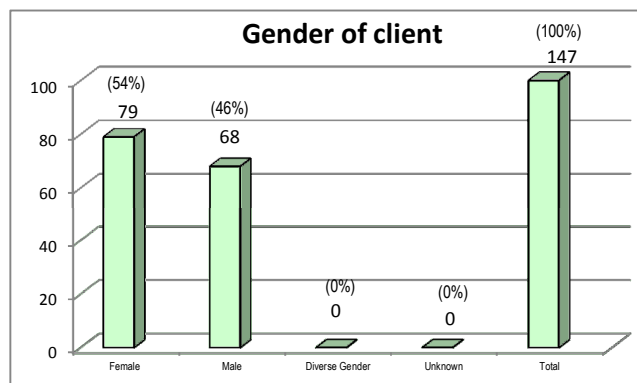
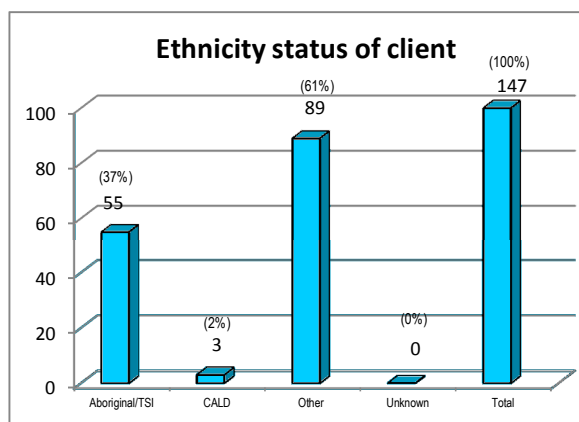
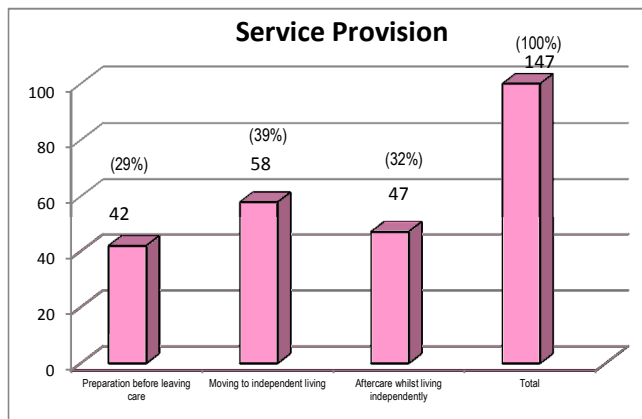
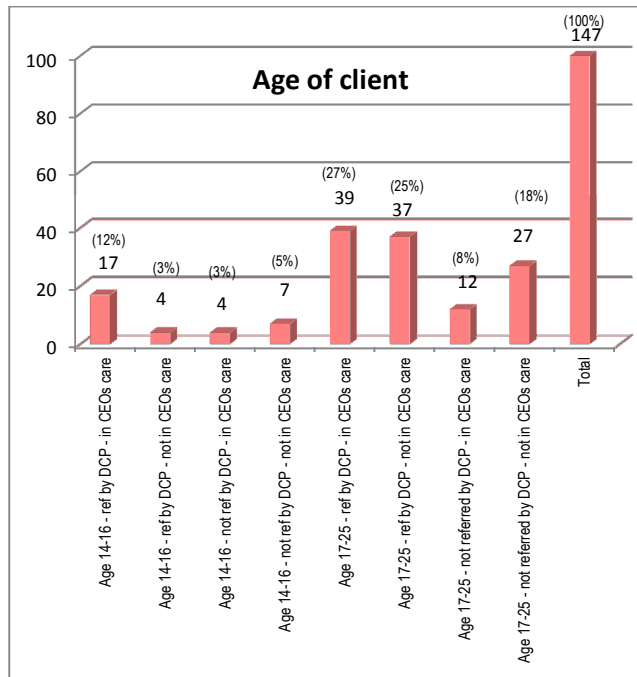


NON GOVERNMENT POLICY AND FUNDING SUMMARY OF SERVICES REPORT LEAVING CARE SERVICES – JULY TO DECEMBER 2010

Leaving Care Services provide advocacy, support and assistance to young people who are preparing to leave or have left the care of the CEO. The Transitional Support Services – Moving to Independence service also provides support to young people preparing to leave or have left periods of supported accommodation, to assist with transitioning to independent living and prevent future homelessness.
