A service to help parents become more effective in managing their child's behaviour

Information for parents



Parent Support can help you create a better life for your child.



What is Parent Support?

Parent Support is a service that works with parents of school aged children up to 18 years of age who are:

- having behavioural challenges in the community;
- taking part in criminal activity; and/or
- not attending school (only if in combination with either of the above).

What will Parent Support do?

A Child Protection Worker will visit your home and provide support and advice to you and your child for up to six months to help you develop ways to appropriately and safely manage your child's behaviour.

We will:

- work with you to improve your relationship with your child;
- support you to increase your skills and be more confident as a parent;
- provide ideas for new ways to communicate with your child;
- help you learn new approaches to discipline; and
- work with your child (if appropriate) to help them behave appropriately and attend school regularly.

Parent Support will develop a Responsible Parenting Agreement with you, outlining how you and the service will work together to improve the care and behaviour of your child.
