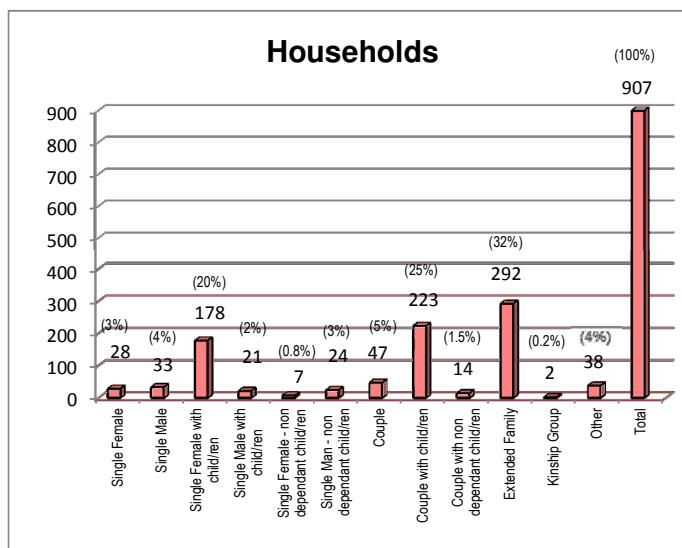
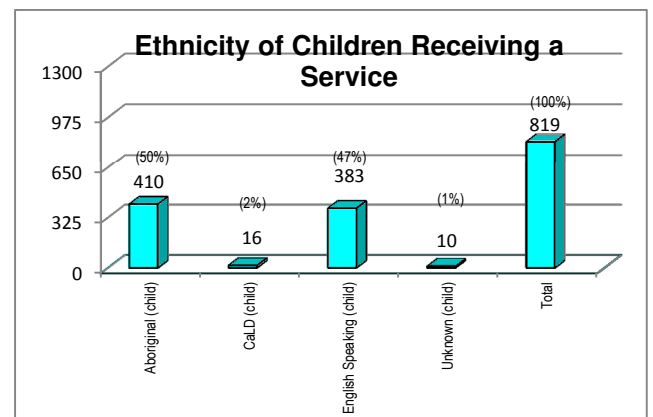
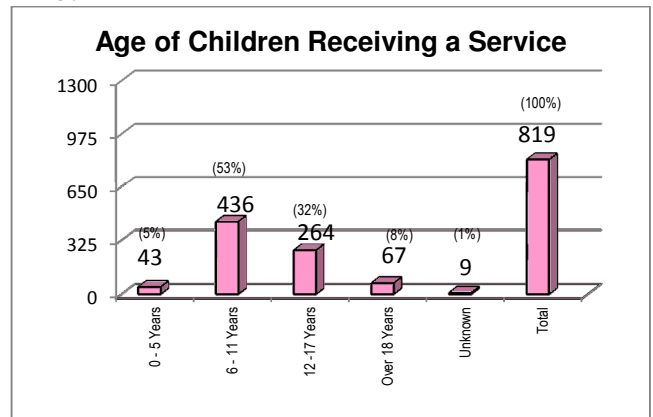
SUMMARY OF SERVICES REPORT

CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE THERAPEUTIC SERVICES – JULY TO DECEMBER 2010

Child Sexual Abuse Therapeutic Services provide healing, support, counselling and therapeutic responses to children and young people and their families affected by child sexual abuse, people who have experienced childhood sexual abuse and children and/or young people who are responsible for, or at risk of, sexually abusing other children. Services assist children and young people to recover from harmful impacts of child sexual abuse, and assist families and communities to support children and young people in the healing process.

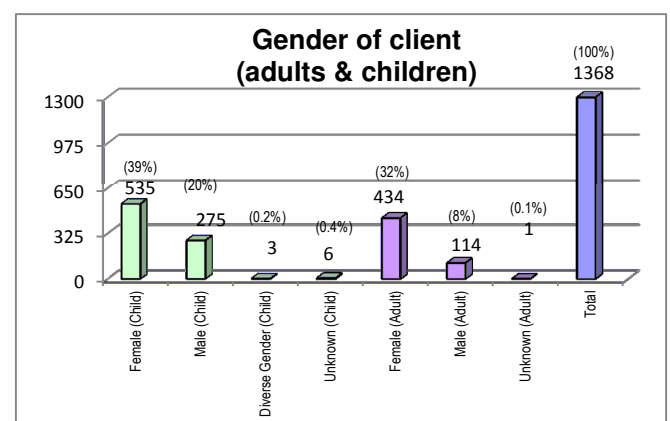

a) A case refers to ongoing assistance provided to a client. The support/assistance from a service provider generally entails one hour or more of worker's time.

(b) Groups refers to all group activities focussing on developing skills and providing support. Groups may be educational, therapeutic or recreational.

(c) Clients refers to Children, young people, adults and families who have experienced and/or been impacted by child sexual abuse or Children and young people who are responsible for or who are at risk of sexually abusing other children.

NB: The sum of individual proportions may not add up to 100% due to rounding
